Mid Wales Centre Welsh 2 Day Enduro will organise a time card enduro event to be held under the National Sporting Code of the ACU, the Enduro Standing Regulations (ESR's), the relevant ACU British Enduro Championship Regulations, the following Supplementary Regulations and any final instructions that may be issued in accordance with ESR 4. Competitors please note the event will use Public Highway. The event is a European Open and a round of the ACU British Sidecar and ACU Classic Enduro Championship and the Welsh Sidecar and Solo Enduro Championship. The event is run under the ACU Premier Insurance.

ATR1 ELIGIBILITY

All riders and passengers must hold a current ACU or SACU licence, and be aged 17 years or over. Any rider or passenger from another FMN MUST produce a licence issued by their FMN together with start permission and proof of personal accident Insurance.

The Enduro includes the use of public highways, it is sole responsibility of the rider to ensure that his/her machine is roadworthy and that he and his machine comply with all legal requirements

Maximum entry of 500 riders

Entries: The only method of entering will be online via the ACU online entry system. Riders will need an ACU Members Logon to enter online. Details on ACU website [Members portal](#)

To alleviate pressure on the ACU entry system there will be a staggered entry system

As sportsman and Veteran classes make up nearly 50% of our entry, they will enter on the second allocation of places.

You should ensure that you are entering the correct class as unless there are spaces available you will be unable to transfer to an alternative class.

A link to reserve list registration will posted on Saturday 26th March at 19:00 (or within 24 hours of event being full if later) – this will be the only method of registering for a reserve entry.

Ride Near Request – this will be activated after all entries have been approved and will be accessed via your ACU entry record, please note this is a request and although we will try to accommodate it cannot be guaranteed, it will close on Saturday 30th April 2022 Midnight. We would also remind you that the event is run by volunteers and any abusive behaviour towards any member of the committee by any means verbal or written may result in your entry being revoked.

If you are not resident within the area of jurisdiction of the ACU (being British Isles, excluding Ireland), the ACU Licence Department will have to set up a record for you. Email licence@acu.org.uk, with your full name, date of birth & address. Scottish Riders will also have to email the ACU.

[Competitors will be required to hold a current ACU enduro licence alternatively upon entering you will be issued and charged for a one event licence. Competitors covered by a SACU or other FIME licence can apply in writing to the event secretary for a refund of this charge after their entry has been accepted.](#)

[Entries will close when full, entries can be cancelled up to midnight on the 13th May 2022 by contacting the Event Secretary \[welsh2dayenduro@gmail.com\]\(mailto:welsh2dayenduro@gmail.com\) in writing. After the 13th May 2022 refunds will only be issued upon receipt of a medical certificate. Refunds will be paid less a £15.00 admin fee.](#)

Change of rider - All entries will be deemed to be in respect of the rider so named and no change of rider will be permitted

[Entry Fee £200.00. Teams: Club, Trade, One Make and Service £30.00 \(Team competition for riders with a confirmed entry only and teams will be taken after entries close\)](#)

The ACU have arranged third party RTA Insurance as a blanket cover across the whole Membership to cover any competitor, marshal or Official signed on for an ACU permitted event which, for the duration of the permit, will allow them to use any motor vehicle in connection with the event in areas of the event where the Road Traffic Act is deemed to be applicable.

Solo Competitors will depart in fours at 1-minute intervals, Sidecars in pairs commencing at 08:01am Thursday and 07:01am Friday.

ROUTE: Will be of Forestry, Farmland and Public roads, there will be designated fuel points on the route which will be clearly marked from the start area. (SPEEDS IN THE FORESTRY, TO and FROM THE START, THE FUEL POINTS, TO THE SPECIAL TESTS, WILL BE A MAXIMUM OF 15MPH). All speeds on public roads will comply with speed limits in force at that time. Route will be reversed on day 2.

SPECIAL TESTS: There will be a number of Special Tests per day, test routes will not be available for inspection until 24hrs before the start or by permission of the landowners. Inspection by any means other than foot will result in exclusion. Location of tests will be given at the start

Signing on/Machine Examination will commence at 10.00am on Wednesday 22nd June, all riders to sign-on by 17:30pm.

Machines will be examined to ensure compliance with the Enduro Standing Regulations and ACU Technical Specifications. Tyres must be 'Enduro' type to current FIM specification with DOT or E mark imprinted (see diagram at the end of Enduro Section). [ACU Enduro Handbook](#)

Machines will be parked overnight Wednesday and Thursday in the Parc Ferme (secured and guarded).

We encourage riders who have finished in the top five of their class in previous years to move up to the next class and reserve the right to move any rider who the committee feel is riding out of class.

2. Sidecar Expert
3. Sidecar Clubman
4. Sportsman
5. Classic Clubman CE1, CE2 & CE3
6. Over 50 (Over 50 at 1st January 2022)
7. Classic Expert CE1, CE2 & CE3
8. Over 40 (Over 40 at 1st January 2022)
9. Clubman E1, E2 and E3
10. Expert E1, E2 and E3
11. Championship

CAPACITY GROUPS

E1 2 stroke – Up to 125cc

E1 4 stroke – Up to 250cc

E2 – Over 125cc to 250cc two-stroke & Over 250cc to 450cc four-stroke

E3 – Over 250cc two-stroke & Over 450cc four-stroke

Classic Classes

To be eligible for Championship points riders must use a machine which falls within the definition of CE1, or CE2.

CE1 – Machines originally manufactured with all the following:

- Two rear shock absorbers,
- Drum brakes front and rear
- Air cooled engine.

CE2 – Machines originally manufactured with TWO of the following:

- Two rear shock absorbers,
- Drum brakes front and rear
- Air cooled engine.

CE3 – Non-Championship class. For machines that do not comply with the requirements for CE1 or CE2 but are over 30 years old

Timing: Special tests will be timed using transponders, riders will not be charged for the use of the transponders but are required to leave a bond for the transponder. Riders are required to leave a cash deposit, ACU licence or similar, one event licences **are not** accepted as bonds. The transponders will be fitted by the organisers on Wednesday 24th June. It is the rider's responsibility to ensure the transponder is returned.

Awards: Premier Trophy - Best performance in each class, runner up trophy, **(except Classic Clubman and Classic Expert Classes where only the overall best performance and runner up across sub classes)**. Team Awards, Service Awards, Ladies Award and under 21. Awards are subject to enough entries in each class.

REFUELLING

Competitors will once again be required to use the provided fuelling service at an additional cost of £90 plus VAT (as at 7/3/2022). This may increase dependent on wholesale fuel costs.

Competitors will be able to fill their machines at the entry to the Parc Ferme, following scrutineering, and at the end of Day 1. The location of the other refuelling points on the course will be announced at signing-on. The actual mileages between refuelling points will be announced at signing-on.

Two-stroke premix, at a ratio of 50:1, will also be available at each refuelling point. Competitors who wish to set up their machines to accommodate this ratio can purchase 25 litres from the service provider in advance of the event.

The appointed official fuel supplier is Vital Equipment who will supply a quality 98 octane fuel to all competitors. Vital Equipment will be responsible for the dispensing of the fuel directly into competitor's fuel tanks from their metered electronic fuel pumps.

Competitors will be required to complete a fuel order form (date to be confirmed) and payment will be required in advance to the service provider.

PLEASE NOTE: USE OF THIS FACILITY IS A CONDITION OF ENTRY TO THE EVENT. Any unauthorised refuelling whether inside or outside of the service areas will result in exclusion.

COVID

These regs have been drawn up on the assumption that no Covid restrictions are in place at the time of the event. Should such restrictions be in place we will include details of any procedures to be followed in the final instructions.
